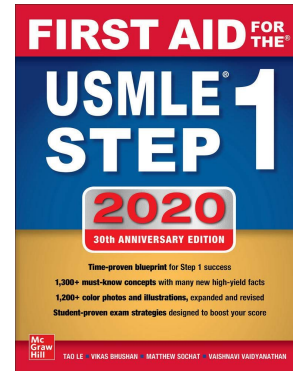


Practicing **English** conversation

1. Recording on zoom

Preventing the spread of **Covid-19**

A small number of students in class or completely online.



Also, we can **make a podcast together** thanks to the technology!

Moreover, it's a great opportunity to familiarize ourselves with some **recording devices** and **broadcasting systems**.

Free

User-friendly

Includes some features to enhance podcast (ex. *transitions*)

Allows for voice messages from listeners

And...

Can be set up to distribute your podcast across multiple platforms

1. Recording
2. Editing
3. Publishing

3. Garage Band



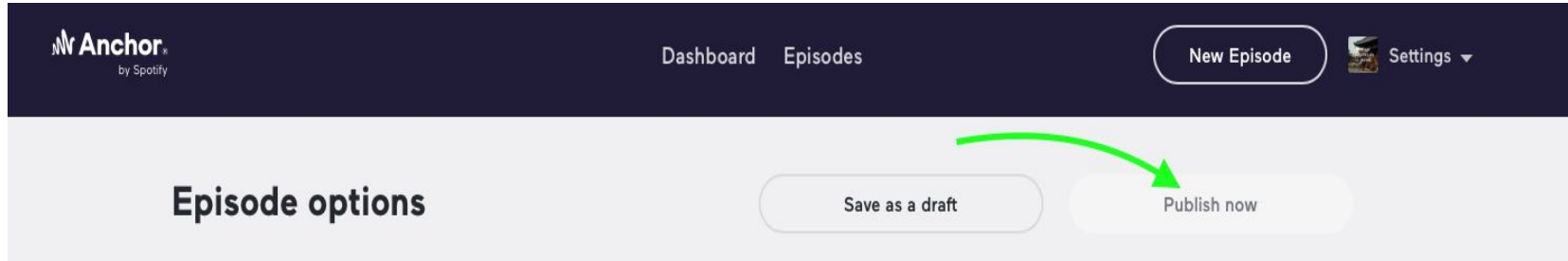
Publishing

A very simple process

1. Return to Anchor site
2. Click "New Episode" button
3. Start uploading (edited) audio files
4. Add transitions
5. Include episode info. (title, description)

Click "Publish now"







